


National Minimum Wage



About this guide

This guide lets you know about your rights to earn money. It tells you who to contact if you have questions.

Who determines minimum wages?

Minimum wage is the smallest amount of money an employer can pay an employee. This amount can be different as there are different types of work. Example: If you work in a restaurant, you will receive the Hospitality minimum wages.



The Fair Work Commission has a team of experts who review minimum wages each year.



They think about:

- information received from employers and employees
- changes in the last year
- research provided by experts.



The minimum wage may increase when the review is finished.

Employers must increase wages by 1st July each year.

What is the current National Minimum Wage?



\$20.33 per hour

OR

\$772.60 a week if you work 38 hours in 1 week.



If you are a casual employee you will get paid 25% more.

This is called casual loading.



Most employees are covered by a modern award

A modern award includes information on minimum wage, your rights as an employee and information about working in a specific job or industry.
